The BWBR Scholarships for Equity in Design are inspired by Milt Bergstedt and Dorothy Birnk Ingemann. Milt Bergstedt, a founder of BWBR, promoted equity in his architectural practice and his community. In 1985, Milt was awarded AIA's Whitney M. Young Jr. Award for significant contributions to social responsibility. Dorothy Brink Ingemann was one of the earliest women to graduate with an architecture degree from the University of Minnesota in 1925. She was a collaborator and the wife of William Ingemann who was the founder of the architectural office that years later became BWBR. Dorothy is responsible for many of the firm's early designs and renderings.

Eligibility

The scholarships are open to **students currently enrolled in a school of architecture, interior design, or graphic design.** Applicants should have completed at least one year of their course of study by the date of application.

This scholarship is not tied to employment, hiring, or contracting with BWBR.

- **Completed Application.** The form is available on the following page. It includes contact information, your school, degree program, and anticipated date of graduation.
- **Design Statement.** A one-page essay, focusing on promoting design in an equitable built environment. The design statement should address the design project.
- **3** Design Project. A single project of the applicant's own design that advances equity in the built environment.
